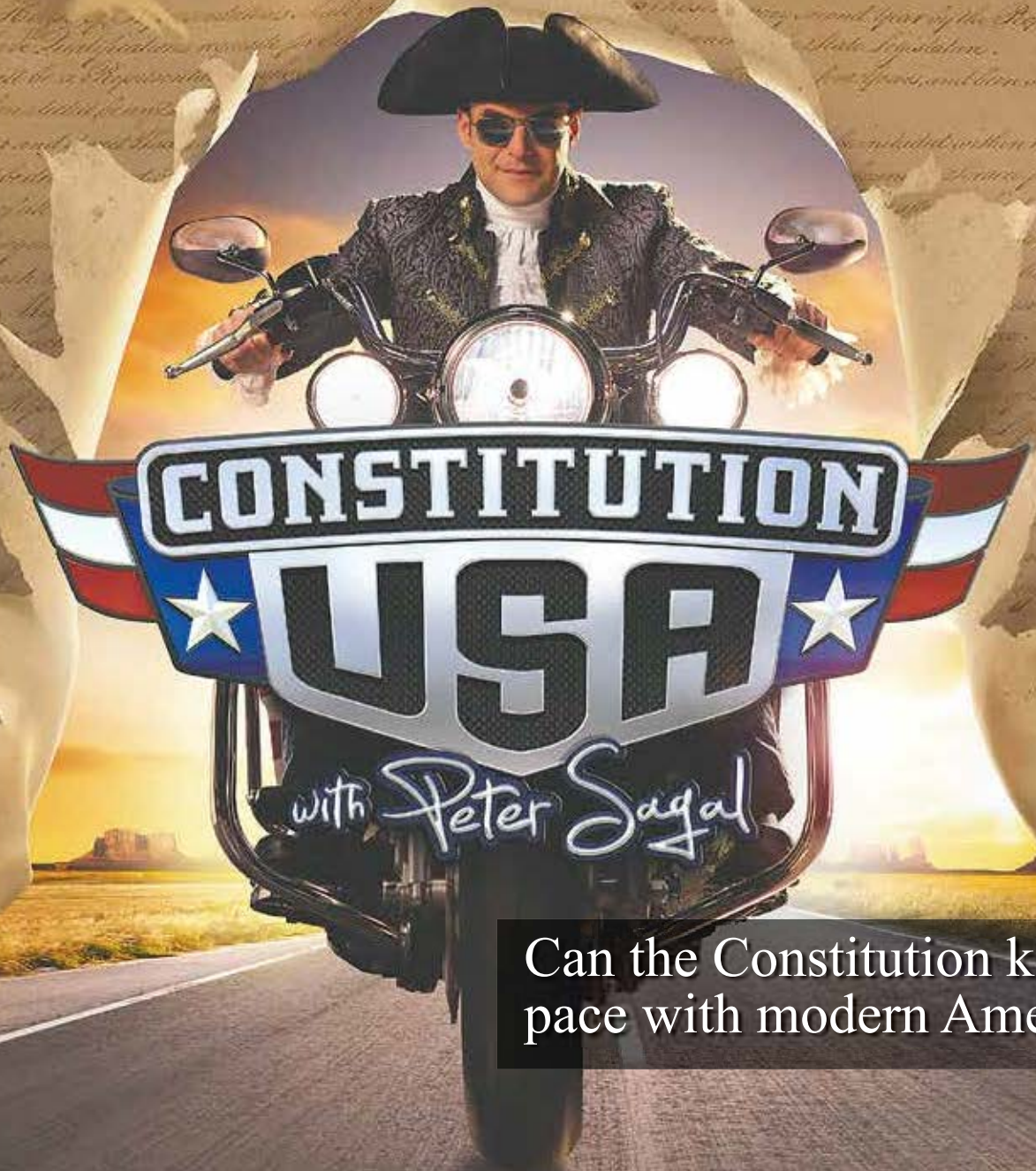

By the time you receive this copy of Dimensions, this will be old news – but we want to be sure our 89.5 listeners know that NPR has decided to end production of Talk of the Nation as of June 27th. TOTN, as it’s popularly known, has been a part of WHRV’s weekday schedule for many years; and has a wide and dedicated following.

NPR says it made the decision because it wants to redirect its resources to support news coverage through the middle of the day, rather than call-in talk programming – that is, to produce programs that include interviews and reported segments like those heard on Morning Edition.

NPR representatives believe this new approach will complement the strong local call-in talk shows that many stations produce – although candidly, I doubt many stations have programs of the caliber of HearSay with Cathy Lewis and Another View with Barbara Hamm Lee!

NPR knows – and we know – that many listeners will be unhappy about this change. They’ve provided contact information for those who want to register their opinions. For email, go to NPR.org and click on the “Contact Us” link. They’ve assured us that emails submitted there will be reviewed by the organization. Listeners can contact NPR Ombudsman, Edward Schumacher-Matos via the “Contact Us” option on NPR.org as well.

That leaves WHRV in the position of having to find a new program to fill the timeslot TOTN occupied. While NPR may offer a substitute program, our Content Officer, Heather Mazzoni and the WHRV Program Director, Anthony McSpadden are taking the time to research all of the programming that’s available – whether from NPR, Public Radio International or any of the other outlets for public radio content – to make sure that what goes on our air is the best possible fit for our audience. Heather and Anthony have already been discussions with other programmers and sources, and are listening to as much content as they can fit into their days (and evenings.)

I can tell you that selecting the right radio programming for a particular time of day and for a particular audience is much more an art than a science. Luckily, Heather and Anthony are both very talented individuals, each with a keen ear for “what works.”

I don’t know as I write this what program they’ll choose, but I do know that it is our highest priority to make sure that what you hear in the 2pm hour on WHRV after June 27th will entertain, engage and inspire you. In the meantime, enjoy the remaining days of Talk of the Nation – only on public radio!

Beginning May 9th on WHRO TV15

Free speech in the digital age. Marriage equality. Voting rights. Separation of church and state. Presidential power in the post-9/11 world.

These are among today's many major constitutional debates. And they're not just being discussed by Justices in the chambers of the Supreme Court, they're being experienced by contemporary Americans as they go about their daily lives.

Peter Sagal – known to WHRV listeners as host of NPR's popular *Wait, Wait... Don't Tell Me!* (heard Saturdays at 11am on 89.5FM) – wanted to find out where the Constitution really lives, how it works, and how it unites us as a nation. So he set out across the country on a customized red-white-and-blue Harley-Davidson to talk with “we the people” and record their fascinating stories – from New York to San Francisco, from Missoula, Montana to Tyler, Texas.

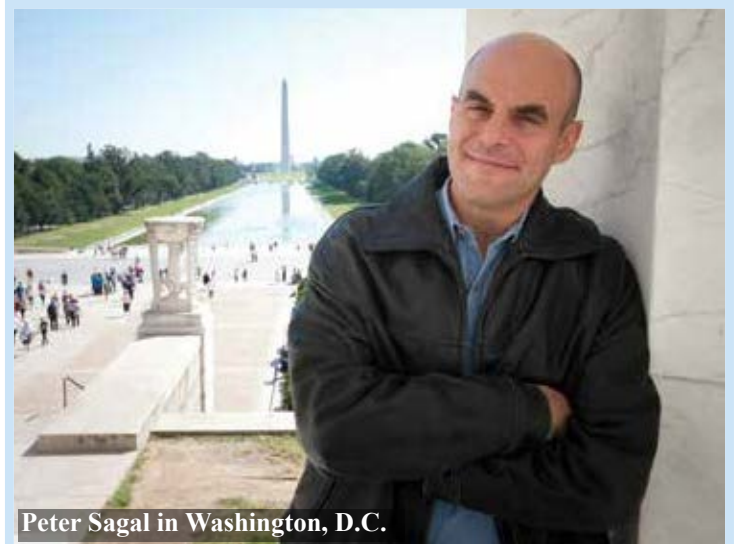
And for each contemporary story, Sagal dives into the history behind it and talks to prominent legal scholars, historians and public figures, finding out

what the Constitution says, the dramatic historical events and crises that defined the Constitution – and why it all matters. Among the experts he consulted are Akhil Reed Amar, Professor of Law and Political Science at Yale University; Joaquin Alvarado of the Center for Investigative Reporting; Guy-Uriel Charles,

Professor of Law at Duke University; Richard Beeman, University of Pennsylvania Professor of History; Richard Bernstein, Distinguished Adjunct Professor of Law at New York Law School; Constitutional

Scholar Linda Monk; and many others of equally distinguished rank. Each one-hour episode of CONSTITUTION USA vividly illuminates a central theme, essential to the Constitution: the document's extraordinary and innovative brand of federalism; individual freedoms and the Bill of Rights; the concepts of equal protection and due process enshrined in the 14th amendment; and the fundamental principle of separation of powers.

CONSTITUTION USA looks at the strengths and challenges of our American system of government: how revolutionary the phrase “We the People” was

in 1787, the struggles by African Americans, women and other groups to be included in those words – and how tensions over the proper size and power of government are hard-wired into the document.

The program explores long standing debates over strict interpretation versus a “living Constitution,” looks at the Constitution's remarkable longevity and even asks whether the Constitution is still “up to” the task of working in the 21st Century.

Far from being a dry historical survey, CONSTITUTION USA is about the passion, big ideas and high stakes that went into the document, and which energize and excite us today. We think you'll be talking about this series long after it's over.

NATURE “LEGENDARY WHITE STALLIONS”

Wednesday, May 1 • 8pm

Hear the story of the world-famous Lipizzaner stallions, from their origins in ancient times to the almost unknown drama of their rescue in 1945. The film, which focuses on the bond that develops between horse and rider, begins at the Spanish Riding School in Vienna. Here the perfect harmony between horse and rider, as well as the beauty and power of the magnificent white stallions, is celebrated in their impressive performance. Their carefully choreographed movements were originally intended for war. Then, only the strongest and most athletic of the horses were chosen. The Lipizzaner stallion was bred for its courage, strength and character, but the horse is also gentle, sensitive and exceptionally responsive to praise.



STRAIGHT NO CHASER - SONGS OF THE DECADES

Thursday, May 2 • 8pm

This performance, filmed live at Harrah’s Resort in Atlantic City, New Jersey, is a journey through the decades of the pop songbook, including Elvis Presley’s “Heartbreak Hotel,” the Four Seasons’ “Big Girls Don’t Cry,” Stevie Wonder’s “Superstition,” Simon and Garfunkel’s “Bridge Over Troubled Water,” Madonna’s “Like a Prayer” and Boyz II Men’s “End of the Road,” all done with SNC’s trademark harmonies and unique charm.



CONSTITUTION USA WITH PETER SAGAL

Tuesdays, May 7- 28 • 9pm

Breathing new life into the traditional civics lesson, Peter Sagal (host of NPR’s “Wait Wait ... Don’t Tell Me”) travels across the country on a customized red, white and blue Harley-Davidson to find out where the U.S. Constitution lives, how it works and how it doesn’t; how it unites us as a nation and how it has nearly torn us apart. Sagal introduces some major constitutional debates today and talks with ordinary Americans and leading constitutional experts about what the Constitution actually says and what it means, the dramatic historical events and crises that have defined it, and why all this matters.



TED TALKS EDUCATION

Tuesday, May 7 • 10pm

Hear inspiring and forward-looking leaders and thinkers on the topic of learning, including Dr. Angela Lee Duckworth, Bill Gates, Rita F. Pierson, Sir Ken Robinson and Geoffrey Canada, among others. Hosted by John Legend, this special focused solely on education marks the first TED project produced specifically for television.



NATURE “THE PRIVATE LIFE OF DEER”

Wednesday, May 8 • 8pm

From coast to coast, some 30 million white-tailed deer make their home in the United States. Deer are the most highly studied mammals in the world, but does the typical homeowner with deer in the yard know how long deer can live? When they sleep? How many babies a doe can have each year? Enter the hidden world of white-tailed deer outfitted with night-vision cameras and GPS tracking equipment to see them not as common backyard creatures, but as intelligent, affectionate family members.

10 BUILDINGS THAT CHANGED AMERICA

Sunday, May 12 • 10pm

A state capitol that Thomas Jefferson designed to resemble a Roman temple, the home of Henry Ford’s first assembly line, the first indoor regional shopping mall, an airport with a swooping concrete roof that seems to float on air — these are among the buildings surveyed in this cross-country journey to 10 influential works of American architecture. Meet the daring architects who imagined them and learn the shocking, funny and even sad stories of how they came to be. They changed the way we live, work, worship, learn, shop and play. Geoffrey Baer hosts.



GREAT PERFORMANCES AT THE MET “RIGOLETTO”

Friday, May 17 • 9pm

Tony Award-winning director Michael Mayer (Spring Awakening) makes his Met debut with a new production of Verdi’s Rigoletto. The new staging moves the opera’s tragic events from a decadent 16th-century Italian court to the glitzy, depraved setting of the Las Vegas strip circa 1960. Polish tenor Piotr Beczala sings the Duke, an amoral lounge singer whose entourage includes the world-weary comedian Rigoletto, sung by Serbian baritone Željko Lučić. German soprano Diana Damrau sings the role of the innocent Gilda, Rigoletto’s daughter and the victim of the predatory Duke. Michele Mariotti conducts his first company performances of the Verdi masterwork, which features one of the most famous arias in all of opera, “La donna è mobile.”



AMERICAN MASTERS “MEL BROOKS: MAKE A NOISE”

Monday, May 20 • 9pm

Laugh as the comedy giant shares never-before-heard stories about his life and career. The program features new interviews with Mel Brooks, Matthew Broderick, Nathan Lane, Cloris Leachman, Carl Reiner, Joan Rivers, Tracey Ullman and others.



THE GHOST ARMY

Tuesday, May 21 • 8pm

War, deception and art come together in this astonishing true story of American G.I.s who tricked the enemy with rubber tanks, sound effects and carefully crafted illusions during WWII. This remarkable tale of a top-secret mission that was at once absurd, deadly and amazingly effective is told through the stories of the veterans, many of whom — like Bill Blass and Ellsworth Kelly — would go on to have illustrious careers in art, design and fashion.
